

DQ Student Advising Considerations

Considerations:

1. Were the circumstances that led to disqualification out of student's control?
 - If yes, consider University Withdraw or Course Withdraw processes.
 - Did repeat courses get adjusted?
2. Has the student identified the factors/circumstances that led to disqualification?
 - If yes, did student actively seek assistance from campus resources?
3. Does the student have appropriate documentation to corroborate the circumstances that led to disqualification? (I.e. medical records or letters; police reports; letters from employers; updated transcripts; letter of support; legal documents; etc...)
4. Has the student developed feasible and realistic plan to succeed if reinstated?
5. Has the student significantly implemented and/or verified any aspects of a success plan?
6. Is the student ready to resume their academic career at CSUSM?
7. Student out one year will have to reapply for admissions to the University. FR/SO will have to wait to complete 60 units from a community College.

Conditions of reinstatement: (examples)

- Enroll in no more than ___ units in the Fall and/or Spring Semester
- Achieve a GPA of ___ in all enrolled coursework
- Meet with _____ do develop an academic plan prior to registering into coursework
- Meet with the Dean of Students to discuss a possible University withdrawal for the ___ semester
- Seek assistance from a Career Counselor to investigate major and career options
- Look into the EOP and ASPIRE programs and services on campus
- Look into the student services offered by the Counseling and Psychological Services Program on campus
- Strongly recommend to limit the hours of employment hours to _____
- Repeat ____, _____, course work in the fall/spring semester
- File a repeat form for _____ in the Office of Registration and Records before the beginning of the fall __ semester
- Utilize the Math Lab/ Writing Center services

Note:

Prior committees have recognized that referring students to community colleges is done with the intent that the student demonstrates successful outcomes with enrolled course work and/or with the success plan. These outcomes will confirm and strengthen the student petition when it is resubmitted at a later cycle. When referring students to the community college, the committee is less concerned in completing outstanding requirements, or recognizing that the student has transferred all allowable units.

Note: Students can take courses they need (LDGE, major prep) at the community college. In addition they can take UD major courses through Open University at other Universities. Advisors should not recommend courses that should be repeated at CSUSM.
