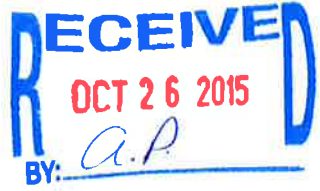

Program Change – Global Studies

October 1, 2015

Global Studies has several areas in which students choose upper division elective courses. Students select a geographic area, two issue areas, and have a requirement of two electives in global culture. We are not proposing any change to the existing structure of the program. What we are requesting is a change to the catalog. The issue we are trying to resolve is that the catalog is a static document, while the courses existing in the College to meet these requirements are not. As soon as the catalog goes live, it is out of date because new courses meeting the requirements of the elective areas will have already come on the books. Hence the catalog copy is always out of date and a disservice to our students. All the classes currently in the catalog can still be used to meet the elective requirements, we are simply asking that they no longer be listed in the catalog.

A year ago, the then-Program Director of Global Studies discussed this with Academic Advising, and it was agreed that this list should be removed from the catalog and instead be kept in the matrix for Global Studies at Advising (and available online for students). The Global Studies Department Chair discussed this with Regina Eisenbach on September 30, 2015 and she agreed that continuing to have an outdated list in the catalog was unnecessary and requested this P-2 be submitted to update the catalog copy.

When new classes are created, the Global Studies Department Chair determines their suitability to meet the elective requirements (either through curricular form review before they are approved or in consultation with faculty teaching the new course) and the course is then added to the matrix by Advising. The matrix is used as a suggested list for students – no course in the matrix is required, but it serves as a guide to students of the options that exist in the College to meet the requirement of the elective area. The new catalog copy contains a link for students to access the most recent matrix through Advising.

MINOR IN GLOBAL STUDIES

The Minor in Global Studies provides students with the opportunity to study international affairs from a variety of disciplinary perspectives. Students can choose from an approved list of courses from Anthropology, Communication, Economics, History, Liberal Studies, Literature and Writing Studies, Philosophy, Political Science, Modern Language Studies, Visual and Performing Arts, and Women's Studies. The minor allows students to specialize in one of five geographic regions: the Americas, Asia, Europe, the Middle East and North Africa, or Sub-Saharan Africa, and in one of five global issue areas: Foreign Policy, Global Conflict and Cooperation, International Law and Human Rights, Global Political Economy and Development, and Gender in Global Perspective.

The Global Studies Minor will be useful to students pursuing careers in education, international business, international development, international organizations (e.g., United Nations), law, non-governmental organizations focusing on international affairs (e.g., Amnesty International), public service, and graduate study in related fields.

Requirements

The Minor in Global Studies requires a minimum of twenty (20) units of credit, at least seventeen (17) of which must be at the upper-division level. Political Science majors may double-count up to a maximum of six (6) units of upper-division coursework toward their major and the Minor in Global Studies. All other majors may double-count up to a maximum of nine (9) units of upper-division coursework toward their major and the Minor in Global Studies
