I hope this finds you well. UCC completed its review of WMST 338 yesterday and we have the following feedback:

1. Acronyms are not permitted in course titles. The title may be exceedingly long to write out all associated words and the committee wondered if there was abbreviated language that may capture the general essence (e.g. Gender identities). Please recognize that we do not have faculty on the committee at present that are experts in this field and thus we were apprehensive to recommend language that may not be fully inclusive.

2. The second sentence of the course description should reflect more neutral language as is consistent with catalog language.
