P-2 Form - Global Teacher Studies and Preparation: International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years, Middle Years, and Diploma Programmes

The Purpose of the Proposal

The purpose of the proposal is to add two additional courses to the existing program. In 2011, the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) and CSUSM approved the School of Education to offer courses of study for the elementary (PYP), and middle (MYP) years IB Educator Certificate in the CSUSM program called Global Teacher Studies and Preparation. In 2015, the IBO authorized CSUSM to add the high school Diploma Program (DP) to the approved 2011 program. Through the year-long IBO application phase, the IB Diploma Program (DP) courses were approved by CSUSM as Topics Courses. Now with full IBO authorization for the DP course of study at CSUSM, we are asking to make these two topics courses permanent. In addition, each of the three levels of IB Educator Certificate course of study conducts field study work. These field study courses, EDUC 632A and EDUC 632B, are identical for all three levels of the IB Educator Certificate program and were approved by the IBO and CSUSM in 2011. The same approved field study courses will be part of the DP course of study.
