This includes, but is not limited to, avoiding discussions that would allow others to identify the subject of the information and removing names from course papers/class assignments. To discuss patient information in a student forum, you may use initials or a name that is not the patients. Failure to protect the privacy of others is a violation of the Health Information Protection and Privacy Act (HIPPA).

- 4. There will be 2 twenty question **quizzes** throughout the course. They will be multiple choice and will be designed to stimulate critical thinking on the topics presented.

<u>Due dates for assignments</u> will be specified. There will be a 2pt/day penalty deduction for late assignments.
