Course Title: Capstone Seminar in Public Health (3 units)

Prerequisites: Completion of all prior required courses in the MPH program.

PH 501, 502, 503, 504, 505, 506, 507.

Catalog Description: Focuses on practical application of public health foundational and concentration competencies in a project-based format. Writing requirement: The writing requirement will be fulfilled by a paper of no fewer than 2500 words.

- 2. Analyze information relevant to specific public health policy issues
- 3. Describe the use of governmental and non-governmental organizations in the delivery of community health services
- 4. Discuss how to develop a plan to promote public health policies through program planning
- 5. Develop a programmatic budget that reflects community resources and economic forces impacting the community
- 6. Describe how to incorporate systems thinking into public health practices
- 7. Discuss the role of strategic planning and marketing within the health care industry as applied to a community.
- 8. Identify the major stakeholders within the community and the environmental factors affecting the planning for and implementation of health care services
- 9. Analyze various management tools and techniques, including program planning and budgeting, demographic analysis, and marketing
