Hi Denise and Susan,

(1). UCC discussed coding of NURS 533T, 535T and 539T. The consensus was that the best option was to have two versions of each of these courses (i.e. NURS 533T-A and NURS 533T-B etc). NURS 533T-A would be coded as C-6 and NURS 533T-B would be coded as C-16. The department then could use the appropriate version depending on the workload of the faculty member. If this is acceptable all we would need are three new C-forms for the B versions of the course. You could just copy the existing forms and add the A designation as well as the C-6 coding. We can use the existing forms and add the B designation and retain the C-16 coding.

(2). In my original email (to Denise) I had also asked the following question:

The purpose of the P-2 form appears to be to add two new specialities to the CNS track: Adult/Gerontology with emphasis in Transitions Care and Pediatric with emphasis in Transitions Care. We do not however, see these two specialities in the catalog copy you had provided. UCC would appreciate clarification on how these two new specialities are listed in the proposed catalog copy.

Thanks for the clarification. This is an interesting situation.

The only possibility I could come up with is to have two courses, for example 533T-A and 533T-B, one coded for a C6 and the other coded for a C16. The program will then have to decide which course to use depending on the duties of the faculty. I am not sure how this would work with student enrollment. Both would be 4 unit courses so there won't be a difference for the students.

How are the classes in which the faculty act as both the preceptor and supervisor vs. those where the faculty just do supervision coded now?

Hello everyone - most MSN clinicals are done with a preceptor, then the faculty assigned do supervision by visiting the student and preceptor, taking care of any issues and grading all assignments and clinical logs. I think C-6 is the right instructional mode. Sometime the faculty do both the precepting and the serve as the faculty for the clinical experience. In this case, I do pay them a workload K-factor of 2.0. This is where Susan supports C16. I guess we use both depending on the circumstance. How do you want to handle this?

Thanks for the email. There seems to be some confusion regarding the number of WTUs for NURS 533T, 535T, 539T. When I received the reply from Denise (see below) I was going to suggest a C6 designation that carries a workload K-factor of 1 and therefore would award 1WTU per unit (as Denise had indicated was the intention).

Denise, I am writing on behalf of UCC regarding NURS 533T, 535T, and 539T that were submitted on 4/20/16. UCC reviewed these proposals (on 8_29_16) and would appreciate clarification on the following points:

1. 533T, 535T, and 539T lists an instructional mode of C16. C16 carries a workload K-factor of 2.0 which means that for these 4 unit courses 8 WTUs would be awarded to the instructor. UCC would appreciate conformation that C16 is indeed the intended mode of instruction. **No, this is not the instructional mode we should use. The faculty should be awarded 1 WTU for 1 unit. What is the mode for that? Please apply it to these courses.**

2. It was suggested that two minor edits be done to the course description for NURS 535T. Remove the word "Provides" from the first sentence. Remove the phrase "Students will collaborate to manage clients across the life span in their area of clinical expertise." and replace with "Focus on managing clients across the life span in various areas of clinical expertise." Please let us know if these edits meet your approval. **I approve of the edits.**
