Thank you. Hope this is clear in response:

- 1. Kine hasn't signed off on any dance courses in the past. Not sure why this course would require as such.
- 2. Are you asking for a rewrite of the syllabus? Or just a list of SLOs. This course is taught by an adjunct, and it is not in my field expertise. I will need some time to confer and articulate the goals.
- 3. Years ago, an Associate Dean encouraged me to offer repeatability for technique and compositions courses. For example, DNCE 390, DNCE 201 and DNCE 301 are repeatable. This for a number of reasons:
  - limited number of courses can be offered.
  - n the arts, he creative material changes with each semester.
  - It's not always a given that there is significant improvement in terms of technical ability. Dance Studies technical and creative courses are based upon improvement and development, not mastery.
