Hi Virginia,

We don't want to change the course to 4 units — we're just changing the course number, and the content from a broad survey of European politics to a more specific focus on contemporary issues. The number change is the first of what will be many course number revisions in PSCI, as we try to bring some order to what is now a hodgepodge of 300- and 400-level classes, with no meaningful differentiation between them.

But we don't want any of them to be 4 unit classes. If we indicated that on the C-2 form, that was inadvertent.
