MASS 470 is the generic Topics course for the Mass Media/Media Studies program. Thus, each section has a different syllabus and focus. To date, we have had 6 sections, each a completely different course. Of these, 3 have become permanent courses, and the expectation is the rest will as well. All 470 courses have been 3 units because the Topics courses in our program that become permanent courses need to be 3 units.
