### 2010-2011 Enrollment Management Plan

California State University San Marcos will have very limited space for Fall 2010 admission due to the severity of the State of California budget and California State University enrollment management directives. All applicants are strongly encouraged to apply for admission to multiple institutions. CSU San Marcos will accommodate new first time freshman and upper division transfer applicants from our local service area -- north of highway 56 in San Diego county extending to southern Orange County and southwestern Riverside County (see list of colleges below) -- who apply during the CSU Fall 2010 priority application period of October 1 - November 30, 2009, and who meet all CSU minimum admission requirements *and all other* University requirements and deadlines for Fall 2010, **which will be strictly enforced**. Prospective students from outside of CSUSM's local service area are welcome to apply for admission during the priority application period, however, CSU systemwide impaction will be utilized -- higher admission criteria, wait lists, academic program impaction, and other options. These applicants will only be considered *if enrollment space is available* after local service area applicants have been accommodated.

### Fall 2010 Upper Division Transfer Admission Criteria - CSU San Marcos Local Service Area

An upper division transfer applicant is a prospective student who has completed at least 60 semester (or 90 quarter) units prior to transfer. Upper division transfer applicants will be eligible for regular admission if they meet the following criteria:

1. Have completed at least 60 transferable semester (90 transferable quarter) units.
2. Have a cumulative transfer GPA of 2.0 or better (2.4 for non-California residents).
3. Are in good standing at the last institution of attendance.
4. Have completed the four Basic Skills General Education requirements (one course in each area: Oral Communication, Written Communication, Critical Thinking, and Quantitative Reasoning/Mathematics) with a grade of "C" or higher.
5. Have completed a minimum of 30 semester units in General Education courses.

For fall admission, all requirements must be completed by the end of the preceding spring term; courses completed in summer 2010 will not be considered in the admissions evaluation. Applicants who have completed fewer than 60 units are not considered for admission at CSU San Marcos. In addition, some impacted academic programs may utilize additional selection criteria from the application for admission.

### Fall 2010 CSU Systemwide Impaction – CSU San Marcos Non-Local Service Area

The California State University has declared systemwide impaction that will result in fewer students admitted for fall 2010. Under impaction, campuses are allowed to use supplemental admissions criteria such as grade point average or wait list students in order to control enrollment. California State University San Marcos has been directed to reduce campus enrollment by 6% for the 2010-2011 academic year and will therefore utilize systemwide impaction to manage enrollment.

As referenced above, the campus may use higher cumulative collegiate GPA, percentage of coursework completed at the last institution of attendance and/or institution of last attendance to select students if enrollment space allows consideration of non-local service area applicants.

## Impacted Majors

**Business Administration:** Applicants admitted as “Pre-Business” and apply to competitive process at Junior standing based upon GPA in pre-business core courses.

**Communication:** Applicants admitted as “Pre-Communication” and apply to competitive process for program options based upon GPA in major preparation courses.

**Human Development:** Applicants admitted as “Pre-Human Development” and apply to competitive process for program options based upon GPA in major preparation courses and additional criteria.

**Kinesiology:** Applicants admitted as “Pre-Kinesiology” and apply to competitive process for program options based upon GPA in major preparation courses.

**Mass Media:** Applicants admitted as “Pre-Mass Media” and apply to competitive process for program options based upon GPA in major preparation courses.

**Nursing/Pre-Nursing (Basic Nursing Program):** Applicants admitted to “Pre-Health Sciences” and must meet criteria during first year to be selected for “Pre-Nursing”. Second screening for upper division major occurs after completion of Nursing core classes based upon academic and non-academic factors. Students who do not qualify for admission to the Nursing program will be encouraged to consider alternate non-impacted majors.

## Steps to Apply for Admission

1. Submit an application and application fee to CSU San Marcos via CSU Mentor during the priority application period (October 1, 2009 – November 30, 2009). You will receive both an email and hard copy confirmation.
2. Submit official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended by February 1, 2010.
3. Check your application status on MyCSUSM.
4. Submit an Intent to Enroll and Enrollment Deposit by June 1, 2010 (admitted students).
5. Register for Transfer Orientation (admitted students).
6. Submit a final, official transcript indicating completion of all admissions requirements in spring 2010 by July 15, 2010 (admitted students).

July 15, 2010	Deadline for final transcripts with all spring 2010 grades

\*\* Transportation: represents an allowance for student's transportation to and from classes and work ( bus fare, gasoline, tolls, etc.) It does not include vehicle payments, insurance, repairs or license fees.

## Financial Aid & Scholarships

Begin the financial aid application process starting January 1, 2010. You do NOT need to be admitted to start the financial aid application process.

Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 2<sup>nd</sup> to receive priority consideration for funds. Applications may be filed online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). In order to meet the March 2<sup>nd</sup> priority date, you may report estimated tax information if you or your parents have not filed your 2009 tax return. The CSU San Marcos Title IV school code is 030113.

There are a number of scholarships administered by CSUSM. You will then be automatically considered for most of the CSUSM administered scholarships which are awarded for that year.
