Survey Background


In Fall of 2023, California State University San Marcos (CSUSM) distributed the <u>Beginning College Survey of Student Engagement (BCSSE)</u> survey through the Office of Institutional Planning and Analysis (IP&A) to new first-time freshman and newly admitted transfer students. The survey was rebranded to the *CSUSM Kickstart Survey* and evaluates the first-year experience with academic and co-curricular programs. The *Kickstart Survey* was administered virtually from August 28-September 11, 2023, and was promoted in partnership with Success Coaching and First Year & University Programs (FY&UP).


This report focuses on **first-year students** and selected survey items to gauge their key high school experiences and expectations for college. In the following 2024 spring semester, these same students will be encouraged to participate in the <u>National Student Survey of Engagement</u> (<u>NSSE</u>) to measure expectations and experiences. 
Incoming Student Characteristics







Which of the following best describes where you will be living while attending college? 731




Results and Comparisons- How to Read the Report

Below the BCSSE Scale score is the mean difference between CSUSM students' score and the mean score of students at other participating institutions.





BCSSE Scales Snapshots






How Students Spend Their Time







Hours per week socializing and relaxing



Students Help-seeking and Concerns for the First Year

Almost all students need academic help at some point. Some will seek out campus resources while others look to family and friends. The following survey items ask where students intend to search for these resources. New in 2023, BCSSE also added survey questions to gauge student concerns. It is important to understand student concerns so that CSUSM can know where to best direct resources and assistance.











Advanced Placement courses completed 845




Dual credit courses completed 842









Gender identity 740




Race or ethnicity 739 (1)
