
First Year Seminar Breakout Report

2023 CSUSM HIPs Survey

In Spring 2023, California State University San Marcos licensed the <u>HIP Quality</u> topical module from the National Survey of Student Engagement and administered the survey to all degree-seeking undergraduate students. 1,465 students responded, for a total response rate of 11.8%. Below are results specific to those who indicated they had participated in or were participating in **First Year Seminar**, using the following definition: *A First-Year Seminar* (known at CSUSM as GEL 101) is a course available to first year students, intended to assist with the academic and social integration to college. The course is interdisciplinary in nature and focuses on topics such as critical thinking, effective communication, goal-setting, and academic success strategies.


Which of the following have you done while in college at CSUSM or do you plan to do before you graduate?









About how long have you been participating in it?




When did you participate in a First-Year Seminar Course? (If you participated more than once, select the most recent).







About how many hours did [do] you spend in a typical 7-day week on a First-Year Seminar Course?





Compared to your typical learning experiences at this institution, about how much effort did [does] the First-Year Seminar Course require?









As part of this experience, about how often did [do] you interact with people from a different background or identity (racial/ethnic, economic, political, religious, etc.)?











To what extent did [do] these meetings focus on what you were [are] learning in this experience?








