When I arrived in 2004, the department consisted of just six teams, 70 student-athletes and five staff members. Today, the department includes 13 teams with more than 300 student-athletes and a staff of more than 40. Over the years, we've added new playing fields and structures. In 2017, we were granted full NCAA Division II status, a major accomplishment that speaks to our commitment to providing our student-athletes with the opportunity to participate in top-notch competition while succeeding academically and personally.
