MAJOR REQUIREMENTS (33 UNITS)

Of the 33 units: Courses must be taken from at least 3 areas that include: Africa, Ancient History, Asia, Europe, Latin America, Middle East, United States, and Comparative/Transnational History. One course must have the majority of its content before 1800. One course must have considerable content on Women's History/Gender. One upper-division course must include explicit digital history and new media technology content. These requirements may be fulfilled simultaneously with other upper-division History requirements (see page 2 of this worksheet).
