LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY (0-9 UNITS):

- AP Language other than English Examination with a score of 3 or higher.
- IB Higher-Level Language A Literature Exam or Language A Language and Literature Exam with score of 4 or higher.
- CLEP with the following minimum score: French Level II: 59; German Level II: 60; Spanish Level II: 63.
- TOEFL or other CSUSM-approved English language exam as a condition for admission to CSUSM.
- Completion at least 3 full-time years at a high school or university where English was not the principal language of instruction.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS (33 UNITS)

Of the 33 units: Courses must be taken from at least 3 areas that include: Africa, Ancient History, Asia, Europe, Latin America, Middle East, United States, and Comparative/Transnational History. One course must have the majority of its content before 1800. One course must have considerable content on Women’s History/Gender. One upper-division course must include explicit digital history and new media technology content. These requirements may be fulfilled simultaneously with other upper-division History requirements (see page 2 of this worksheet).
