LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT (0-9 UNITS):

- Linguistics Majors must demonstrate proficiency in one language other than English. Proficiency can be accomplished by:
- Earning a grade of C (2.0) or higher in a third semester course in a language other than English (including signed languages), or
 - Passing a proficiency exam in a language other than English, or
 - Earning a score of 3 or higher on an AP Language other than English Examination, or
 - Having been required to take the TOEFL or other CSUSM-approved English language exam as a condition for admission to CSUSM, or
 - Having completed at least 3 years full-time at a high school or university where English was not the principal language of instruction.
 - There may be other ways to demonstrate proficiency. Consult with Linguistics faculty. The language proficiency requirement cannot be met with computer languages.
