## Student Advocacy Committee Duties and Responsibilities:

- **2.2.1** Shall identify and discuss concerns and issues impacting students at California State University San Marcos and within the California State University (CSU) system.
- **2.2.2** Shall be informed of governmental, legislative, and political agenda items under consideration by the California State Student Association.
- 2.2.3 Shall review ASI Resolutions prior to consideration by the ASI Board of Directors and make recommendations unless the ASI Board of Directors determines that the Resolution should not be considered by the Student Advocacy Committee. Resolutions may be brought straight to ASI Board of Directors only under time sensitive constraints and per Chair approval.
- 2.2.4 May receive concerns brought by students against University processes and practices and may forward concerns to the ASI Board of Directors for consideration and/or action.



## The Student Advocacy Committee shall consist of the following members:

- 2.1.2.2 ASI staff member designated by the ASI Executive Director

2.1.3 Officers

- 2.1.3.1 The Chair of the Committee shall be the ASI Vice President of Student and University Affairs
- 2.1.3.2 The Vice Chair of the Committee shall be elected from the voting membership of the Committee

## Who Are We? Parking and Commuter Services

Established to provide parking facilities and resources.

100% Self Support Program

- No State Support
- Revenue is Generated by User Fees
- All Parking-Related Expenses are Paid by Parking and Commuter Services (PACS)



# **Two Main Funds Within PACS**

### **Parking Adjudication**

## Why Charge (so much)?

California Code of Regulations dictates that a fee must be paid for all vehicles parked on campus property

Chancellor's Office Decentralized Parking in 1995

- All CSU campuses responsible for own costs of operation
- One of the newest CSU Campus, building from the ground up

Must cover all expenses and be able to build future parking


## Alternate Mode (Commuter) Programs

### • Bicycling (Personal Mobility Devices)

- Bike Racks no cost to use. Be sure to lock appropriately where allowed.
- Bike Lockers low cost: \$30 key deposit, \$15/semester rental rate
- Carpool/Vanpool
  - Proximity spaces, cost for permit is shared among users, permit doubles as General when driving alone (if alone, don't park in Carpool space)
- Transit Pronto
  - Discounted Monthly and Semester Pass Available
  - \$57.60 for Monthly and \$177 for Semester
  - Valid on NCTD Sprinter (light rail train) and BREEZE buses and MTS Buses and Trolley. Not valid on Coaster
- Zipcar
  - Two vehicles located on 1<sup>st</sup> Level of PS1
  - Daily rates starting at \$69/day or Hourly rates starting at \$7.50/hr

## Got a Ticket? Now What?

Pay or Appeal within 21 days of the date of the ticket Failure to take action will result in a \$30 Late Fee and/or DMV Hold and/or CSUSM Hold

Ticket Appeal Process Ticket must be appealed within 21 calendar days from the date of the ticket (ticket date is day1) Process takes 8-10 weeks to complete. Determination letter will be sent to address provided. Status can be checked online. Level 2 available for upheld appeals.

# **Parking for Student Housing**

General Parking Permits available for resident students:

- Academic Year
   Monthly
- Semester Daily

With General permit, Parking is allowed in ALL General Lots. Overnight restrictions in XYZ, PS2, Special Event areas (within Lot B, Lot F, 6<sup>th</sup> level of PS1). Closest parking areas to Student Housing properties:

- Lot O Lot N
- Lot K PS1 Levels 1-5
