

Information Packet

Search Process

Each year the Cal State Student Association (CSSA) engages in a search process to send at least two, but no more than five, **student nominations** for the California Governor to consider for appointment on California State University (CSU) Board of Trustees. This packet outlines the important dates and steps to complete the application portion of the search process. To learn more about CSSA, CSU Board of Trustees, and the two students currently serving as Trustees, please visit <u>calstatestudents.org</u>. Important Dates

Monday, January 29, 2024 at 5pm	Deadline for all application materials
Monday, February 19, 2024	Applicants are informed of their status in the process
Saturday, February 24, 2024	Student Trustee Search Interviews (Virtual Only)
Week of February 26, 2024	Interviewees are informed of their status in the search process Finalists' materials sent to the Governor's Office

Step 1 - Minimum Requirements

Applicants and position holders must be:

- 18 years or older,
- eligible for in-state tuition based on the following:
 - a citizen of the state of California as defined by <u>California Government Code 241</u> or qualify for exemption from paying nonresident tuition as defined by <u>California</u> <u>Education Code §66016.3</u>
- a current undergraduate student maintaining 6 semester (9 quarter) units or a current graduate student maintaining 3 semester (4 quarter) units,
- in good standing, and not on academic, disciplinary or administrative probation, have obtained a 2.0 or greater grade point average during the previous term, currently or will attain at least sophomore standing by July 1, 2024

Step 2 – Verification Form

Applicants that meet the minimum requirements, as outlined in Step 1, must be verified by your campus' Vice President of Student Affairs or designee.

- Set a meeting with your Vice President of Student Affairs or designee,
 - When scheduling your appointment, explain your interest in applying to be a Trustee of the California State University and you will request a verification of your status at your university from you Vice President of Student Affairs or designee.
- Complete the <u>Digital Verification Form</u>
- Save your verification form as a .pdf and title it *lastname_verification.pdf*. You will submit this with your other supporting documents in Step 6 Digital Application.
- Late verification forms will result in an incomplete application and not be considered.

Step 3 – Recommendation Letters

Applicants will need two to three individuals to submit a letter of recommendation on your behalf. Letters of recommendations should be non-relatives that can speak to your skills, abilities, and knowledge that will make you an excellent candidate for a Trustee position on the CSU Board of Trustees. Applicants request the recommendation letters be emailed to search@calstatestudents.org with the full name of the applicant noted in the email by no later than January 29, 2024 at 5:00 pm. Late recommendation letters will result in an incomplete application and not be considered.

Step 4 - Resume

Applicants will provide a resume that includes relevant experiences, including but not limited to work (paid and/or unpaid), volunteer positions, and other leadership experiences. If you need assistance developing your resume, you are encouraged to visit your campus career center.

• Save your final resume as a .pdf and title it *lastname_*resume.pdf. You will submit this with your other supporting documents in Step 6 – Digital Application.

Step 5 - Essay

Applicants will need to include an essay, no longer than 750 words, to the following prompt:

Explain some of the issues the CSU is currently facing and how you would work on those issues as a member of the CSU Board of Trustees.

• Save your final essay as a .pdf and title it *lastname_essay.pdf*. You will submit this with your other supporting documents in Step 6 – Digital Application.

Step 6 - Digital Application

Before starting the <u>Digital Application</u>, ensure you have the following materials prepared to upload:

- Verification Form saved as a .pdf file; titled *lastname_*verification.pdf
- Resume saved as a .pdf file; titled *lastname_*resume.pdf
- Essay saved as a .pdf file; titled *lastname_*essay.pdf

Complete the <u>Digital Application Form</u>. **All materials for the 2023/2025 Student Trustee Application are due January 29, 2024 at 5:00 pm. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.**
