"The vicious cycle of poverty can be broken when a child poor in material possessions acquires spiritual wealth through music." Possible volunteer activities include: video recording of classes and performances; updating website & Facebook information and postings; publicity, press releases, brochures; preparing documentation to secure non-profit status; coaching young musicians—opportunity to learn to play a string instrument; piano/guitar accompaniment at classes and performances; written record keeping of program data; family/ community liaison - bilingual English/Spanish needed; driving to lead performers to a performance site.
