




## A Note From The Dean ...

### **Cultural Performance of Silence in Pedagogy Hosted by Comm Asst Professor Gutierrez-Perez**

The Faculty Center is hosting a workshop this week on Cultural Performance of Silence in Pedagogy. Join Faculty Fellow for Diversity, Inclusion, and Social Justice Dr. Robert Gutierrez-Perez for a workshop that will explore the ways in which silence can be a meaningful and productive part of pedagogy. We will challenge the traditional view of silence as a negative attribute and explore how it can be used to communicate,

learn, and create. This workshop will explore the role of silence in pedagogy from a performance paradigm perspective, and how silence can be interpreted differently depending on the cultural context. We will also consider the implications of silence for student learning and assessment.


