WHAT ARE TEST OPTIONAL POLICIES?

Test-optional colleges and universities will not require SAT or ACT test scores when determining admission eligibility. This gives students the choice to decide whether to submit test scores or not.





WHY ARE SCHOOLS GOING TEST OPTIONAL?


Many colleges and universities chose test-optional policies due to Covid-19-related hardships.

These schools also began to review standardized tests and found they provided negligible value to the admissions process.

After considering the equity and fairness of the tests, systems like the CSU opted for the permanent discontinuation of their use in admission consideration.

80% of colleges & universities in the United States have put test-optional policies in place

3 key barriers to
accessing and
preparing for tests.

Test Optional policies may help remove these barriers and make higher education more accessible



Lack of geographic accessibility to testing centers



Lack of accessibility to college and test preparation courses



Lack of financial resources to take tests

HOW DO TEST OPTIONAL POLICIES BENEFIT FAMILES OF AI/AN STUDENTS?
