This is a **fully online program** that can be completed in 16 months. The program is scheduled in eight-week semesters in spring and fall and five weeks during the summer. New students are admitted three times a year, in spring, summer and fall.

- Successful completion of a minimum of 60 transferable units
- Successful completion of SOC 101 and 201
- Successful completion of the following courses with a C- or better (12 units)
  - Oral Communication (A1)
  - Written Communication (A2)
  - Critical Thinking (A3)
  - Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning (B4)
