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
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# Transitions and Pandemic Lessons

This is my first newsletter, and I am so happy to be here serving this campus in any way I can.

As I transition here at CSUSM, I believe that we have many opportunities to create a sustainable future for the campus and our community. The global pandemic has been very challenging, but it has also taught us some valuable lessons.

We learned we are capable of great flexibility in delivering academic programs to our students in difficult times. Our use of technology tools allowed CSUSM to provide a virtual education experience to students through the pandemic and allowed them to continue their college journey. These technologies will serve CSUSM well as we move into the future.

We learned the nature of work is changing and that remote work is not only possible but can be just as productive as on campus—in many cases. Certain positions require more on-campus time, and other positions cannot be performed remotely at all. But as we consider campus repopulation, we will have the opportunity to evaluate positions on campus through a telecommuting lens. For those who cannot telecommute, we will investigate schedule options that will address the needs of our campus while allowing staff flexibility. We are continuing to learn how space will be impacted by our changing work environment. Soon we'll begin a building-by-building review of our campus and consider innovative ways to use any space that can be repurposed to improve the student experience.

Finally, we learned to partner with others in a greater way. The pandemic presented opportunities for improved collaboration within and outside of the CSU system as we worked together to address many challenging issues that arose with COVID-19 and the battle to arrest its spread. In my short time here, I have been privileged to speak with most of my fellow VP FAS colleagues across the CSU. We are working on solutions together with guidance from the Chancellor's Office.

I have embraced these lessons and I look forward to more learning opportunities as I continue to settle in at CSUSM. It will be a very interesting time as we consider how to provide the best possible educational experience for our students and a prosperous institution for our campus community and beyond. I am excited to tackle the future with all of you.

Since March 2020, we have had to rely on teamwork and collaboration to provide for our employees and campus community during a time of uncertainty, ever-changing priorities, and shifting deadlines.

In anticipation of our return to campus this Fall, those charged with ensuring a safe place of study and work began planning for a large-scale testing facility on campus that would help the CSUSM community stay safe as we repopulated our campus.

In our search for space, we were immediately approached by CSUSM Athletics with an offer to use the Clarke Field House for the testing facility. Jennifer Milo, Athletics Director, and her team willingly offered up their space and time to help oversee the COVID testing resources on campus. They have made our partnership smooth and focused on getting to solutions quickly and with great humor and flexibility. We are pleased to recognize Jen and her team with the Key Collaborator Award, in recognition of their above-and-beyond partnership in service of our campus community.

# Sustainability Corner

Wow has this year flown by. I feel like I blinked, and we are days away from 2022. As the holidays are around the corner, I wanted to spend this Sustainability Corner talking about waste. In the U.S., we throw away 25% more trash between Thanksgiving and New Years than any other time of year. That equals about 1 million extra tons of trash going to the landfill per week! In addition, we also have about 25% more food waste as well during the holidays. Although we are still dealing with COVID, many of you might be bringing in treats or having a meal with your colleagues, and therefore you may have some food waste in your departments.

At CSUSM, you may have noticed a few new greencolored bins located around campus. Those new bins are the launch of our organics composting program. Our goal of Zero Waste by 2025 will only be achieved if we develop a robust, organics program.

Our organics program can take a variety of items that traditionally went in our landfill bins. These items include:

- All Food: Cooked or raw meat, poultry and seafood (including bones), cheese, dairy products, fruits, vegetables, grains, pasta, eggshells, bread, coffee grounds, tea bags, tea leaves, baked goods, nuts, jelly, candy, snack foods, leftovers, spoiled food
- Food- Soiled Paper: Paper bags, paper napkins, paper towels, paper plates, paper cups, paper take-out containers and take-out boxes (with no plastic or wax coating, and with metal removed), greasy pizza boxes, coffee filters, tissues.

Over the next few months, we will be placing even more green compost bins around campus. We also will begin piloting to offer organics composting in break rooms/ kitchenettes in buildings and in housing.

This is the biggest change to our waste program in years, and we hope that you will help us reach our Sustainability goals. FAS has always been an important part of our success and I am sure you will embrace this new program with open arms.

# We Are Hiring - Community Service Officers



# Markstein Hall South Stairwell Repair

The Markstein Hall South Stairwell was severely corroded and in need of repair. The paint was peeling off and the stair treads were loosening. Because the building was minimally occupied due to COVID-19 the opportunity arose to close the staircase for repairs. Scaffolding and containment were installed, the contractor sand blasted the metal staircase to clean out the rust and painters then painted the stairs with rust inhibiting paint. An additional contractor repaired the stair treads. Waterproofing was installed under the treads to preserve the metal as well as anti-slip material on the bull nose of the treads. New LED lighting was installed on both North and South staircases.



### **CSUSM Innovation Hub**

The build-out of the CSUSM Innovation Hub within ELB was completed with furniture, maker spaces, and AV installations. The newly completed space will further CSUSM's commitment to innovation. The vision for the space is to serve as a gateway to campus as we emerge from the pandemic. The innovation hub will be used by students, faculty and community members. In the lounge and collaboration zone there are 15 nesting tables and 30 rolling classroom chairs that can be staged in front of the Video wall for classes, then stored in the storage room.

In **SBSB** an existing Sociology closet on the 4th floor was renovated to become a single occupant **Gender Inclusive Restroom (GIR)**. In Arts, an existing men's and women's restroom on the 1st floor was renovated to become single occupants GIRs.



A **Container storage lot** (40' X 128' with a 6' chain link fence and a 12' asphalt drive lane) was created to hold 6 40' containers. The storage container lot and new recycle yard will limit the placement of storage containers throughout campus into a central location for assist with CSUSM department's storage needs.



**FDMA** experienced considerable **growth** with the addition of several new employees and a reorganization. The FDMA suite was renovated to make room for everyone! An existing door was removed to make space for a new cubicle. Feel free to stop by, say hi and see for yourself!

Please help us congratulate **Bella Newberg** on her retirement and thank her for her many contributions during her nearly thirty years of dedicated service. For those who had the pleasure of working closely with Bella, you would describe her as an empathetic, caring, and transparent leader; a go-getter with an ability to successfully complete initiatives through collaboration; and, a visionary whose actions embody supporting students' success always.

Bella's career began at CSUSM in 1992, serving in the Planning, Design, and Construction (PDC) department where she later assumed the role of Director for Procurement, Contracts, and Support Services. With the help of our campus customers and FSO, we exceeded the Disabled Veteran Business **Enterprise spend requirement of 3%**. This requirement is difficult to meet, and we managed to exceed it with 8% spend in 2020-2021.

After a busy summer, fall represents a wrap of our audit season, and Fiscal Services has **successfully completed all three auxiliary audits**. The stateside audit is just about complete and is expected to be finalized in January.





