

# Welcome Back CSUSM Faculty!

I am excited to begin my first semester as the Faculty Center Director. The Faculty Center has been formative to my success at CSUSM and I hope to continue the programming and support that have become hallmarks of the Faculty Center while working with all of you to develop new events and opportunities that can best serve faculty at CSUSM.

The Faculty Center was a busy place this past summer with our Canvas Basics, Canvas Summer Teaching Institute, and Flipped Canvas Boot Camp programs to help with our learning management system transition from Moodle to Canvas. We also provided support and training for 27 new tenure track faculty hires via our New Faculty Institute (NFI) and look forward to supporting new lecturer hires at this week's New Lecturer Orientation programs. It's always exciting to have new colleagues join us, especially at a moment when the campus is poised to welcome the largest first-year student class in our history!

As our campus community works towards having more in-person learning experiences and more chances for campus-based events, I'm excited to share with you the theme for this semester's Teaching & Learning programming, co-led by Faculty Center Associate Director, Jimmy Young: (Re)Connection and (Re)engagement.

We'll be focusing on a series of programs from informal brown-bags to workshops that consider how we help students get (re)connected and (re)engaged in our classroom spaces and how to rebuild learning communities. This will be a complement to our broader Faculty Center programming on rebuilding our own faculty and scholarly communities. Students and faculty have faced numerous challenges since March 2020 and it is a period that has been marked by ongoing stress, trauma, loss, isolation, and more. Our theme of (re)connection and (re)engagement for our teaching and learning track will focus on positive ways faculty can reimagine their classroom spaces for active and community-building learning practices as well as pedagogical practices that consider the digital and technological possibilities for active and equitable learning.

(Re)Connection and (Re)engagement will also thematize our Fall programming more broadly as we relaunch the Faculty Center Connections program that helps faculty meet colleagues from across campus and other opportunities to re-engage your scholarship and creative activity. Connection is also about care, so later in Fall we will have a brown-bag series that will help faculty think about how to re-engage and reconnect while being mindful of the importance of boundary setting and self-care.

In addition to our new programming, we have returning programs such as Faculty Learning Communities (FLC), the Faculty Mentoring Program (FMP), and our usual events on Retention, Tenure, and Promotion and WPAFs.



# Introducing, Dr. Jimmy Young










# Personalized Support
