Thanks to donor support, the School of Arts welcomed 10 visiting Black, Indigenous, and artists of color to provide guest lectures, master classes and community performances that reached more than 300 students and 600 community members. STUDENT SUCCESS

Bolstered by philanthropy, the Faculty Mentoring Program pairs first-generation college students who are at risk of not reaching graduation with a faculty member to increase retention rates. 100% of first-time freshman who participate in the Faculty Mentoring Program persist to their second year of college!



Philanthropic investment made it possible for us to launch our engineering program which now boasts a 90+% retention rate for our underrepresented minority students and transfer students.

CSUSM has become a beacon for students in our region offering wraparound services, like a summer bridge program and a dedicated academic advisor, that retain students and encourage them to keep aiming high.
