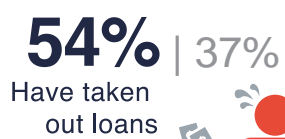
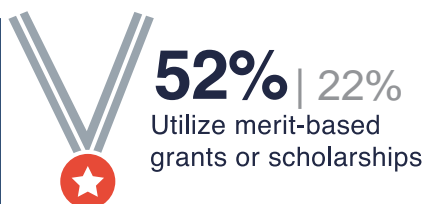

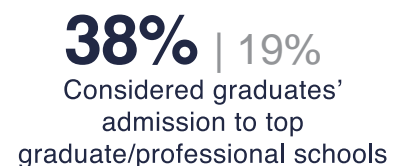

Students use a variety of sources to fund their first year of college.



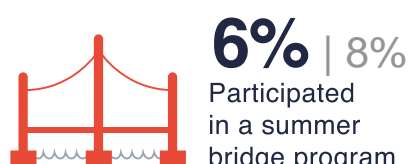
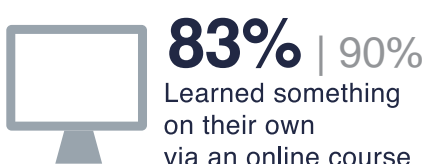
