

Depth of Study Requirements

Linguistics

Purpose: The purpose of the linguistics depth of study is to provide students with the opportunity to examine the principal topics and fundamental ideas that inform the field of linguistics. In LING 100: English Grammar and Syntax, students begin with a detailed study of the grammar and syntax of the English language, and then build on that knowledge in Ling 300: Introduction to Linguistics, which briefly covers the major subfields of linguistics, and applies that knowledge to a consideration of both English and non-English language data. Students then have the opportunity to choose two courses from a wide range of upper-division linguistics courses. Each of these courses allows students to explore a subfield of linguistics in depth; all linguistics classes at CSU San Marcos involve a consideration of both English and non-English language data, as well as the opportunity for hands-on data-gathering and analysis. Finally, all students in the depth of study finish by taking Ling 480: Field Methods. This class allows students to utilize the knowledge acquired in the depth of study in an analysis of language use as provided by a consultant speaking a language other than English.

Preparation for Linguistics Depth of Study Module

The following courses are taken as part of the Liberal Studies major requirements:

Required:	LING 100: English Grammar and Syntax	3 units
Required:	LING 300: Introduction to Linguistics	3 units

Upper-Division Required Courses for the Linguistics Module

Choose Two:	Choose any two 300 or 400 level LING classes	6 units
Required:	Ling 480: Field Methods (Offered in Spring Only)	3 units
