Homeowners - Wells Fargo, U.S. Bank, Citibank and JPMorgan Chase — as well as 200 state-chartered banks and credit unions will allow affected homeowners in California to defer payments for at least three months. Late payments would not be reported to credit agencies. Contact your Mortgage Company for questions about eligibility and deferment.

Eviction Moratorium: Tenants may not be evicted for non-payment of rent through May 31, 2020 subject to certain conditions. Rent continues to accrue during this period, however, and must be paid in full to avoid future eviction.
