## CSU San Marcos Fees Definitions

## **Definitions**

Beginning Balance: Ending balance from prior fiscal year - 2021/22.

**<u>Category I Fees:</u>** System-wide mandatory tuition and other fees that must be paid to apply to, enroll in, or attend the university, or to pay the full cost of instruction. Category I Fees are not included in this report.

Category II Fees: Campus mandatory fees that must be paid to enroll in or attend the university. (1)

<u>Category III Fees:</u> Fees associated with state-supported courses, specifically for materials and services used in concert with the basic foundation of an academic course offering. <sup>(1)</sup>

<u>Category IV Fees</u>: Fees, other than Category II or III fees, paid to receive materials, services, or for the use of facilities provided by the university; and fees or deposits to reimburse the university for additional costs resulting from dishonored payments, late submissions, or misuse of property or as a security or guaranty. <sup>(1)</sup>

**Category V Fees:** Fees paid to self-support programs such as extended education, Cal State Online extended education offerings, parking and housing, including materials and services fees, user fees, fines, and deposits. Self-support programs are defined as those not receiving state general fund appropriations; instead, fees are collected to pay the full cost of a program. Costs of self-support instructional programs include support and development of the academic quality of the university. <sup>(1)</sup>

Ending Balance: Sum of beginning balance and net income / loss.

**Expense**: All expenditures for the fiscal year.

<u>Net</u>: Total income less expense for the fiscal year.

<u>Other Income</u>: Interest Income for Health Facilities, Student Union and ASI.

**<u>Revenue</u>**: All fee revenues for the fiscal year, net of waivers.



## Explanation of CSU San Marcos Fees

Academic Excellence and Student Success (AESS) Fee: The AESS fee will support three priorities: add sections for high demand courses, expanded library hours and resources, and student academic support.

<u>Academic Records Fee:</u> Funds are used for diplomas (printing and mailing of diplomas), graduation ceremony, and transcripts (unlimited transcripts).

Associated Students Fee (ASI): This fee is collected for and controlled by Associated Students, Inc. (ASI). Associated Students, Inc. is a nonprofit auxiliary organization of the university.

Athletics Fee: Funds are used to augment support for the intercollegiate athletic program.

<u>Child Care Services</u>: Funds are used to maintain and operate the Center for Children and Families.

Health Facilities Fee: The Health Facilities Fee is charged to support the campus Health Center Facility.

Health Services Fee: The Health Services Fee is charged to all students, to make a basic concert of campus based health services available. Is a self-support department within the Operating Fund.

**IRA Fee (Instructionally Related Activities Fee):** Funds are used to provide support for essential educational experiences such as: intercollegiate athletics, drama and musical productions, art exhibits, publications and journalism.

<u>Mental Health Fee:</u> To enhance the academic performance of matriculated students, these services shall include accessible, professional mental health care; counseling, outreach and consultation programs; and educational programs and services.

**<u>Recreation Fee:</u>** Funds are used to expand and implement programs and services offered such as funding for student development, new and substantial programming events as well as provide funding to improve the Student Lounge furniture and recreation activities.

**Student Union Fee:** The Student Union Fee is paid to support the university Student Union, Clarke Fieldhouse and Sports Center Facilities.

<u>Course Related Fees:</u> Fees associated with courses. Specifically materials and services used in concert with the basic foundation of an academic course offering.
