To place the NEAC Consent Calendar on the 3/4/15 Senate Agenda for approval.

IX. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. BLP: Moving Self-Support Academic Programs to State Support

- This document has been updated to read as a policy.
- The Provost has stated he will review in careful detail and forward feedback before a possible second reading at Senate.

Motion #4 M/S/P*

To place **BLP:** Moving Self-Support Academic Programs to State Support on the 3/4/15 Senate Agenda as a Discussion item for a first reading.

B. EC Member Concern: Motion/Resolution for EC to Endorse Student Access Initiative (SAI)

- Parliamentarian Whittlesey suggested that EC consider making a motion about SAI before the 3/4/15
 Senate meeting. Rules allow for a motion to bring items to senate in two ways: 1) From a Senate
 standing committee (moved and seconded) and, 2) by someone standing up at Senate and stating they
 would like to move that an item be placed on the agenda for discussion and as a possible action item.
 Whittlesey suggested that if EC did not take some action regarding SAI before the Senate meeting on
 3/4/15, Senate members may see that as a sign that EC does not support or endorse the item.
 Discussion ensued with voices both in support and not in support of such a motion.
- It was decided that an anonymous paper ballot vote would be taken to determine if EC wanted to send a
 motion to Senate endorsing the Student Access Initiative (SAI). If the vote were Yes, EC would then have
 to draft a motion to bring to Senate.

Motion #5 M/S/P Votes: Yes 5; No 8; Abstain 1 – Motion <u>does not carry</u>.

To send a motion to Senate from EC, endorsing the Student Access Initiative (SAI).

EC remains neutral on the SAI.

C. FAC: Assigned Time for Exceptional Levels of Service to Students

- FAC presented its Assigned Time for Exceptional Levels of Service to Students policy. This policy complies
 with a new CBA provision which provides approximately \$18,000 (approximately nine WTUs) in funds
 this year, and each of the next two years to fund assigned time for exceptional service performed by any
 faculty unit employee (this includes all Unit 3 employees TT, lecturer, coach, librarians, SSPARs, etc.)
 This policy must be created, approved and implemented in a very condensed timeline.
- A timeline will have to be developed when this policy is approved.
- This policy may be revised in the Fall, even if it is not currently designated an interim policy.
- Suggestions for changes and discussion ensued. It was agreed that if approved by Senate at a second
 reading in April, the Senate Officers will work out some of the timeline details in consultation with the
 Provost's office and an expedited review by the President will be requested.
- It was determined that FAC would accept EC's feedback, amend the document and have it ready for the Senate Agenda (3/4/15).

Motion #6 M/S/P*

To place an amended version of *FAC: Assigned Time for Exceptional Levels of Service to Students* on the 3/4/15 Senate Agenda as a Discussion item for a first reading.

D. GEC: Proposed GE Assessment Plan

- With the assistance of University Assessment Specialist Melissa Simnitt, GEC shared its plan to assess GE Program Learning Outcomes.
- Information will have to be shared with instructors on a short timeline; a schedule is forthcoming. The
 plan is to begin the first assessment in Fall 2015 with all GE courses assessed over a three year cycle.
 GEC will try to make assessment minimally intrusive for instructors. GEC will develop a common broad
 rubric or means of assessment and provide it to instructors being assessed.
- GEC will be tasked with determining how each learning outcome will be measured within each area. It's possible GE will have to break into sub groups to complete assessments as outlined in the plan.
- Associate deans have been asked to assist in determining which courses will be assessed within their colleges for each GE PSLO.
- Graduate Student Learning Outcomes will be developed next.
- The GE Assessment Plan is on the 3/4/15 Senate Agenda as an Information Item.

E. APC: Academic Freedom Policy

- APC shared its proposed Academic Freedom Policy, designed to meet the WASC review criteria which addresses integrity and transparency.
- This policy states a commitment to academic freedom. In writing this policy, a task force met with many people from across campus to make certain the policy reflects shared views.

Motion #7 M/S/P*

To place the **Academic Freedom Policy** on the 3/4/15 Senate Agenda as a Discussion item for a first reading.
