Victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking can apply for a restraining order (Civil or Domestic) at any of the San Diego Superior Court Locations. Victim Information and Notification Everyday (VINE)

VINE is a free service that allows victims, witnesses, and the public to obtain timely and reliable information about criminal cases and the custody status of offenders 24 hours a day.

Users are able to register an e-mail address and/or telephone number(s) in order to be notified when an inmate is released, is pending release (for sentenced inmates with scheduled release dates), or when transferred to a facility in another county or state prison.

California Victim Compensation Program

The California Victim Compensation Program (CalVCP) can help pay bills and expenses that result from qualifying violent crimes (including sexual and domestic violence). Some expenses that may be covered include medical and mental health bills, relocation, income loss, home security and other crime related expenses. Safe at Home

Safe at Home (SAH) is a free address confidentiality program for survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking provided by the Secretary of State. SAH provides participants with a Sacramento post office box to be used as the participant's official home address in order to safeguard the survivor's actual location. Domestic Violence Shelters

There are shelters in San Diego County that specialize in helping domestic violence victims. In addition to housing, most also provide services such as advocacy, legal, counseling, and additional resources unique to the needs of domestic violence survivors.
