<u>Victim Information and</u> <u>Notification Everyday</u> (VINE)	VINE is a free service that allows victims, witnesses, and the public to obtain timely and reliable information about criminal cases and the custody status of offenders 24 hours a day.	877-411-5588
<u>California Victim</u> <u>Compensation Program</u>	The California Victim Compensation Program (CalVCP) can help pay bills and expenses that result from qualifying violent crimes (including sexual and domestic violence).	800-777-9229
