### <u>Defensive Driving</u>

#### Status: Not Started

- One or both <u>online courses</u> <u>are not</u> completed: login to <u>Learnerweb</u> to complete course(s) and then turn in <u>required</u> <u>paperwork</u> to SH&S
- Both online courses <u>are</u> completed, but <u>required paperwork</u> was <u>not</u> turned in: complete paperwork and turn into SH&S

#### Status: Expired

- Certification has expired after 4 years
- Login to <u>Learnerweb</u> and retake BOTH (if applicable) online courses
- Resubmit required paperwork to SH&S
   \*\*Please note that expiration date reflects
   the same expiration date of the first online
   course taken (date 4 years minus 1 day)\*\*

#### Status: Not Started

- "IIPP," "NEO: Cougar Crash Course," or "Emergency Preparedness" training courses were not attended
- Login to <u>Learnerweb</u> to launch and complete the "CSUSM IIPP" online training course to satisfy compliance



# Safety Standouts: Distribution Services


Congratulations to Distribution Services for reaching 5,300 days accident-free!
